SACSCOC AND CROSS-LEVEL LISTING OF UNDERGRADUATE/GRADUATE COURSES

Standard 9.6 – Post-Baccalaureate Rigor and Curriculum: progressively **more advanced** in academic content, knowledge of literature, ensure engagement in research and/or appropriate professional practice & training

University Policy 3002 requires cross-level listed courses to demonstrate "specific, unique expectations for each course" and requires that "graduate students will do not only **more** work, but **more advanced** work than undergraduate students."

In practice, SACSCOC requires separate syllabi for UG and G sections of cross-level listed courses. All syllabi will need to demonstrate the differences between the two sections – not just different assignments and grading scales, but also different learning outcomes that demonstrate more advanced content knowledge.

The self-study will need to include 4-6 examples of syllabi from G/UG cross-level cross-listed courses.

Policy 3002 needs to be revised – revisions will be forthcoming with implementation for Fall 2021.
